Other PE resources have been used for playtimes and lunchtimes. Children have the opportunity to be a playground leader and help staff with the allocation of PE equipment in the playground. Pupils in Y2 and Y5 spend a day at the English Institute of Sport at an annual event which involves pupils competing with other schools. We work within our Learning Community to attend and provide a variety of sporting events with other school on a regular basis

Our overall aim is to raise standards in P.E. and school sport, increasing the participation and opportunities offered to our children. We aim to provide higher quality lessons and improved learning for all.

- Following the success of Roughwood winning many cluster events and securing places at borough finals; there has been an increase in children wanting to take part in half termly sports club. As a result of this interest clubs have been organised and arranged for children to take part in. The additional funding has allowed for a specialist PE teacher to provide CPD, particularly with new members of staff and modelled lessons in football, cricket and tag rugby. This will be continued over the coming term. The teachers who have already received this training have used it with their classes and both the teachers and the children have reported an increase in their enjoyment.

We are aiming to gain the recognition that the children at Roughwood need. KS2 pupils have taken or will be taking part in a movement evening, cross country, football, netball and athletics at Wingfield Academy.
