Happy Diwali:

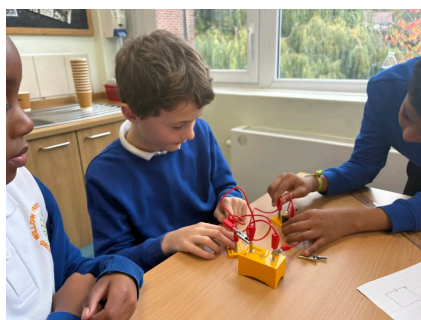

Year 6 explore electrical circuits:

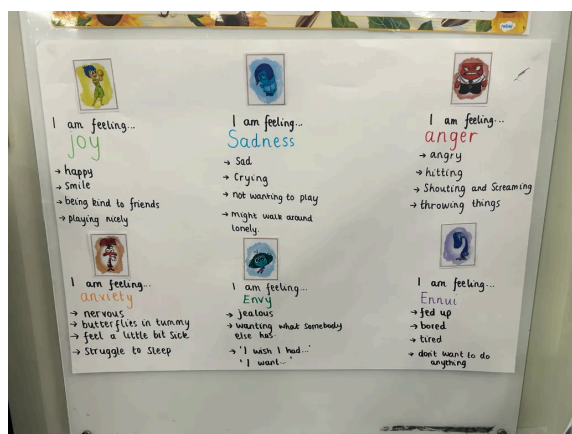

The children and staff were touched at the donations and we would like to thank families for their generosity in helping the Kimberworth community!



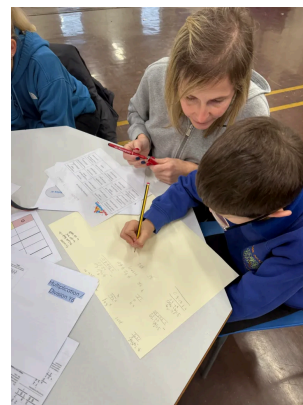
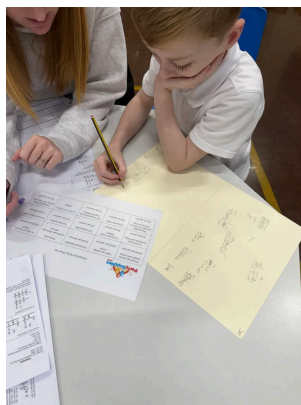
WTA Boccia and Kurling:

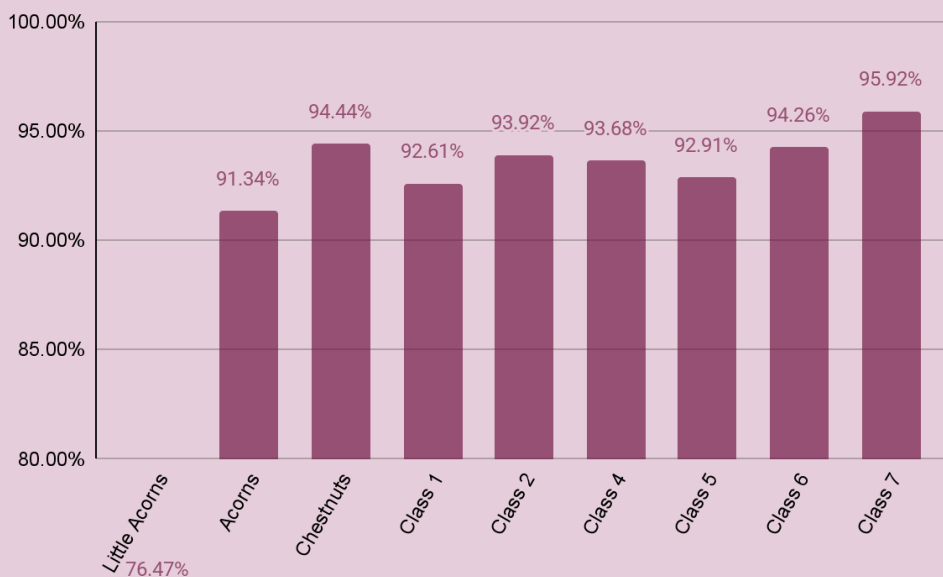


Can you show me 4?
